Other Degree Requirements

*The BAS in Business is a 124-hour degree. Besides the

■ Professional Development (24 hours):

This section includes 12 semester hours in business
electives, 6 hours from upper-level electives and 6
semester hours in general electives, for a total of 24
hours.

■ **Experiential Professional Development:** Up to 12
semester hours can be earned from work experience with
military performance evaluations, job performance
appraisals or a supervisor's evaluation on a WBU form.

■ **General Electives:** Nine semester hours required.
