History Made Real

It is a documentary that took place in Tennessee. The name of the movie is “Paper Clips.” It is the story of a little town just northwest of Chattanooga, called Whitwell, right in the foothills of the Appalachian Mountains. It’s a poor town. It could have been any town in Appalachia. Mining stopped there some thirty years ago. There’s not much left in the town for the people to do.

The principal of the middle school realized that everybody was like everybody else in that little community. In the school, there were no Jews, no Catholics, one Hispanic, and a couple of African-Americans. The principal of the middle school wanted to enlighten her eighth grade students about the world. She wanted to help them to understand diversity and what the rest of the world was like.

So, being the principal that she was, she sent her assistant principal to Chattanooga to a conference on diversity. He came back and said, “I think we ought to study the Holocaust to try to understand how a Christian nation could exterminate six million Jews.

So they put themselves into the project. They read books and looked up articles on the Internet. But then one child asked, “How do we even know how many six million is?” None of them had ever seen six million of anything. It was simply too big to comprehend. Maybe they should collect six million of something.

So they went to the Internet. They found out that the paper clip was invented in Norway years ago, and during World War II, Norwegians sympathetic to the cause of the Jews would wear paper clips on their collar as a kind of secret code.

So the class decided to collect six million paper clips. They wrote letters everywhere -- to celebrities, presidents, corporations, friends, everyone they could think of -- asking for paper clips. This was in 1998. They got paper clips from President Clinton and from former President Bush. Some came from movie stars. One company out in California sent 100,000 paper clips. But the campaign stalled at about 175,000. Maybe they should lower their sight, they thought, and collect one and a half million -- the number of children that were killed.

Then a German journalism couple that covered the White House for years got wind of their project and they came down to visit this little town of Whitwell, Tennessee. They were so excited about it that they went back to Washington and got a reporter from *The Washington Post* to write about it, and they began to write letters to Germany. Tom Brokaw got wind of it and *NBC Nightly News* did a feature. The paper clips started pouring in from all over the world, with stories about the Holocaust.

A Holocaust-survivors group out of New York heard about them, and six of them came down to visit. The whole town met at a small church in Whitwell to hear their stories.

One older, soft-spoken gentleman from Poland told his story about when he, his mother, and his little brother were put in one of the old railroad boxcars and sent to one of the concentration camps. They traveled all night. When they got off the train, he remembers a man standing there telling some to go to the right and some to go to the left. His mother and little brother went to the right. He went to the left. The next morning he asked one of the guards where his mother and brother were. The guard just pointed to the smoke coming out of the smokestacks. It was only later that the boy understood what had happened to his mother and to his brother.

Eventually, over 29 million paper clips came in. They began discussing what to do with all those paper clips and the principal, almost in passing, said, “Wouldn’t it be something if we could find one of those old German railroad cars that transported the Jews to the death camps and bring it here and make a memorial museum on the grounds of the school?”

Well, with the help of the German journalism couple, one was found. And if you go to Whitwell, Tennessee today, you can tour this museum directed by an eighth grader who will show you eleven million papers clips in there, plus letters, mementos and pictures that people have sent them. Why eleven million? Because not only did the Nazis exterminate six million Jews, they also exterminated five million other people that were different -- gypsies, homosexuals, Jehovah’s Witnesses, and others who were “different.”

What about all those other paper clips they collected? When you go there, they will give you one of those paper clips as a reminder of what distorted power, mad obsession and instilled fear can do.

IQ Web Online Registration

IQ Web is an online tool that contains information about your academic records. You can view unofficial transcripts, print a class schedule, and more. This can be done from any location that has an Internet connection. First, you must set-up an IQ Web account.

How do I access IQ Web?

1. Go to www.wbu.edu
2. Click on IQ Web Access
3. Click on Request Access.
4. Click on Current Members of Wayland Baptist University without IQ Web access.
5. Type in the requested information. **YOU WILL NEED YOUR PC ID NUMBER FOR THIS!** Contact your local campus if you do not have this number.
6. Make sure that you create a password hint, just in case you forget your password.
7. Click on Request Account.

What if you cannot access the system?

If you have a hold on your account or cannot access the system, please contact your local campus.

Once access has been granted...

1. Go to www.wbu.edu
2. Click on IQ Web Access, on the left-hand side
3. Click on Log In
4. Click on Online Registration under courses
5. Select year/term (make sure you select courses for the Wichita Falls Campus)

Uses of IQ Web...

Students can use the site to change demographics, update personal information, view grades, view course schedules, view unofficial transcripts, get account information, view their current address, and view financial aid information.

Key Things To Remember About IQ Web:

1. You must have a clear account and be admitted into the university
2. **You must see a counselor for advisement to be able to register**

Veterans' Affairs (VA)

Wondering About Financial Aid and Scholarships???

Just as a reminder to financial aid students, the process to obtain Federal/State Financial Aid takes 8-12 weeks to complete. All financial aid students MUST have an award letter before using financial aid at registration. All students MUST have an admission letter from the University to be eligible for Financial Aid. Please see a counselor for further clarification.

The 2009-2010 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) is now available. A complete FAFSA must be submitted to the Federal Student Aid Information Center requesting that the analysis be sent to Wayland (CODE # 003663). The form may be obtained and submitted over the Internet from the website: <http://www.fafsa.gov>. However, the student must still see the Financial Aid Advisor.

Angie Mowery, the Financial Aid Advisor, would like you to know of a scholarship available. There is the military spouse scholarship that is worth \$200.00 a semester. Applicants must complete a 500-word typed and double spaced essay. Applications and further details are available through Mrs. Mowery.
